




**THE STORY OF BANU NADIR**

Prophet Mohammad was invited to Madina to broker peace between the warring tribes in 622AD. He arrived with a group of followers who were given shelter by the indigenous community known as the Ansar. Amongst his first actions was the construction of the first mosque in Madina, as well as obtaining residence with Abu Ayub Al-Ansari. He then set about the establishment of a pact, known as the constitution of Madina, between Muslims, the Ansar, and the various Jewish tribes of Madina including Banu Nadir, to regulate the matters of governance of the city, as well as the nature and the extent of inter-community relations. The conditions of the pact included boycotting the Quraish (because they were persecuting Muslims and were constantly looking for opportunities to go to war with them), assistance of one another if attacked by a third party as well as defending Madina in case of a foreign attack. All the different groups signed the constitution of Madina.

Banu Nadir signed the constitution of Madina along with everyone else. They were not open and honest about their feelings. They used to pretend that they were working for the best interest of the community of Madina and yet whenever they got an opportunity they would encourage the Quraish to attack Madina. When Quraish failed to defeat the Muslims, Banu Nadir decided to kill Prophet Muhammad and Quraish assured them that they will help.

Prophet Mohammad was invited by Banu Nadir for a religious debate with a condition that he was not to bring more than three people with him. He accepted both the invitation and the condition. On his way to the religious debate he was informed by a member of the Banu Nadir tribe who had become a Muslim that there will be an attempt to assassinate him at the religious debate. Allah protected Prophet Mohammad and his three companions from the deception of the Banu Nadir.
