



# Sports Premium Impact Report 2016 - 2017



Aim	Key Actions	Impact
<p><b>Increase the opportunities for competitive sport including transportation</b></p>	<p>Support regular sports tournaments, festivals and competitions for all. Continue to take part in Sainsbury's school games to gain silver award. Further develop inter-house- and inter school -sports competitions for pupils of all ages by providing transport to and from competitions. Provide more out of hours/extracurricular activities and experiences. Lease of mini bus to transport pupils to and from competitions.</p>	<p>The number of children taking part in interschool sports competition has almost doubled since the last academic year. Children have been introduced to opportunities to take part in sport away from school, 8 children went to district football trials, with 2 being selected for the squad. Sports day has been expanded and now includes heats, semi-finals and finals for all events with points awarded for house teams. The new school mini bus has had a major impact on the increase of pupil participation in competitive sport.</p>
<p><b>Increase opportunities for children to access extra-curricular activities</b></p>	<p>Provide places for pupils in breakfast, lunch and after school sports clubs by increasing the number of sporting activities available. Additional dance teacher for requested clubs (cheerleading, gymnastics) Subsidising outdoor and adventurous activities on residential trips.</p>	<p>A wide variety of after school provision has been available for children. Sports coaches from outside agencies and KSSP have delivered sports such as Judo and Cricket and KDDK has delivered Dance, Cheerleading and Gymnastics throughout the year. Year 6 went on their annual residential week to Brecon Beacons.</p>
<p><b>Improve the quality of teaching, subject knowledge and learning in PE and develop assessment</b></p>	<p>Professional training for staff to raise their confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport through the Kingsbury School Sport Partnership. Subject leader 5 day release and cover. Purchase additional resources and equipment to enrich the curriculum. Replacing old/worn equipment to improve the enjoyment/experience of PE for all children and staff.</p>	<p>PE lead has attended training through KSSP and other staff members have benefitted from specific training such as High Quality Dance and Gym. Teachers are being empowered to deliver high quality PE lessons that are effective and enjoyable. Resources have been purchased, where necessary, to ensure that lessons - and after school activities - are resourced well enough to be effective.</p>
<p><b>Improve engagement and physical activity of children in PE and celebrate achievements</b></p>	<p>Buying additional PE kit to encourage all children to participate fully. Purchase certificates and awards to celebrate achievements.</p>	<p>Kit is available to be offered to children who do not have theirs in school for curriculum PE. This has led to a decrease in non-participants during PE lessons. New school football kits have been purchased, producing a team ethos and a sense of pride and belonging. Sport is reported on weekly in the school newsletter, children are far more aware of how to represent their school. Events are always oversubscribed and we now have to hold trials to enable teams to be picked for competitions. Our annual sports award ceremony is used to celebrate all successes and children look forward to the event. Marsh Hill has developed a sporting ethos where children really want to be part of the success and want to be recognised for sporting achievements.</p>
