Science: **Our Body Parts**



Last week you went on a sense walk around your home.

Can you remember how many senses we have? Can you

name the body part needed to see? What body part is

needed to hear? What part... to smell and taste with?

What body parts are needed for the sense of touch?

Discuss the importance of each of these body parts. Play the Body Part Game. Take it in turns, name different parts of the body. The winner - the last one speaking who does not hesitate or repeat a body part!

Maths: **Counting**

Can you count up to 100?

Can you bounce a ball or clap while you are counting? What can you count at home? E.g. stones, buttons, pegs or peas. What numbers are hidden around your home? Can you read them? Your house number. Can you see 30 on the washing machine? Count up to 30. Whatever number you see at home, read it to an adult then count up to the number.

Adults can ask you questions e.g. what is 1 more than 11? 1 more than 19? What is 1 less than 7? ... 1 less than 13? 1 less than 26?

History/Geography: **My Local Area**

Think of your journey to school from your home. Discuss with an adult - What do you see? A park? Shops? What other buildings do you pass? Can you draw a picture of your journey to school? Keep it safe. When you come back to school could you use it as your guide?

Art & DT:

Can you create a body or a face using things around your home? Challenge Can you label the body parts? Be creative you can use food, cotton buds, material. Take a picture and send it to us.
