We are continuing with our topic Celebrations. When we celebrate we often have parties. At the moment we can't celebrate altogether but we can imagine what it will be like when we can celebrate a lovely event with our friends and family.

For Literacy we would like you to plan a celebration. Who would you invite? What food would you have? What games would you play?

Could you make a list of all the people you would ask?

Design an invitation for your celebration.

Understanding our World.

The weather is starting to get cold and the world around is changing. We have talked about the leaves falling off the trees, the nights getting darker and the weather being wetter and windier. Can you learn the names of the seasons and think about what season will be next? Can you find out what month will start the next season? You could draw a picture of what you think the world will look like in each season.

Number

We are now extending our counting and matching skills to estimating amounts. Ask an adult to draw some quantities in your book. Look at them for 2 seconds then cover them up. Can you estimate how many you think you saw? Can you say if it was more than 10 or fewer than 10? Now count them was your estimate really good?

Now try counting them again but remember to add I more to your count. See if you can say I more than a number all the way to 20.

What is I more than 4? What is I more than 16? What is I more than 0? What is I more than 10? Can you find the number 4 on this number line and say what number is I more than this? What do you notice about the number that is I more? Where is it on the number line? Try to do lots as this will always help you.
