Website App

The school's new website is finally up and running – we are adding information and important events/dates on a daily basis. Along with the website, we now have an app that is linked to the website content. So if you download the new app, you will automatically receive instant messages and reminders relating to any whole school events and to your child's year group.

Open either the App Store for Apple devices or Google Play for Android devices.

Search for 'The Parent App' – look for the image as shown on the right. 'Phenix Education' are the app creators.

Download the app and then open it.

Search for 'Marsh Hill Primary School'.

Choose the year groups that you wish to receive information from – ideally the year groups that your children are in.

Save the settings.

You may have to turn on 'banner notifications' within your phone's display settings to receive instant notifications. Otherwise, check the app frequently to see what's taking place relating to Marsh Hill.

Dairy Dates

Next week you will receive the key dates for the Autumn term. These dates may be subject to change and we will let you know as soon as possible if they do.

Uniform

Safeguarding

If a child ever feels unsafe it is important that they let an adult know so that, where necessary, appropriate help can be provided. Should their worry come out at home then we can only help if you tell us about it at school.

Equally, we will do everything we can to help if a child chooses to share their concern in school. Every school is required to have a member of staff known as the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), a deputy DSL and a Safeguarding Governor. In our school the persons concerned are:

All staff then have a responsibility to take appropriate action, working with other services as needed.
