Black History Month

This year at Marsh Hill the focus for Black History Month will be based around equal opportunities; and there will also be a focus on influential Black Britons. For example, Year 1 will learn about Marcus Rashford who is not only an outstanding young footballer but is also an advocate and ambassador for disadvantaged children across the country.

While Year 3 will learn about the children's author Malorie Blackman who was the first black person to become Children's Laurette. Malorie Blackman was appointed to this position in 2013 for "outstanding achievement" in her writing.

Birmingham's own Benjamin Zephaniah will be studied by Year 4. He is not only a world famous award winning poet, but he also has sixteen honorary doctorates and a wing of the Ealing Hospital in London is named after him. Benjamin has done a lot of charity work related to both human rights and animal rights.

At the end of this month we will collate work from children across school to form a virtual presentation that will be available for parents and carers to view on our school website from Friday 6th November.

Reading Workshops Online

The online Reading Workshop materials for Year 5 and Year 6 have now been uploaded on to our school website. These are an excellent resource and they come with examples of questions that parents and carers can use to support children's understanding of texts.
