PSHE and Relationships Education

As part of implementing the RSE curriculum, all schools must consult with pupils, parents, staff and governors to ensure there is a general consensus on our approaches to policy and the curriculum content. We have bought into the scheme 'Jigsaw', which is an excellent scheme for covering all aspects of the PSHE/RSE curriculum in an age-appropriate way. As a school, we have taken the decision to not teach the sex education aspect of the Relationships curriculum.

We will be starting our consultation process with parents on Monday 7th December 2020; the consultation will close on Monday 14th December 2020.
