It couldn't have been any better than this." MacMillan says that 'every penny raised' has an impact. £375.09 was raised by our wonderful school community by this event. To put that into context, £236 pays for a MacMillan nurse for a day, helping people living with cancer and their families receive essential medical, practical and emotional support.

As we head into the half term holidays, I would like to share just some of the fabulous costumes worn by our children at last week's fabulous Halloween Disco.




## Apology
