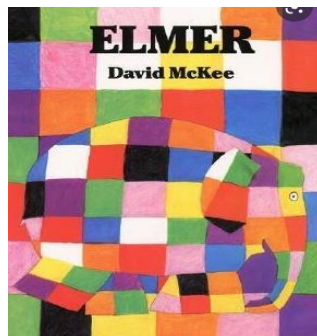
Christmas Dinner
