Dear Parents and Carers,

COVID- 19 update

While the new term has found us dealing with staff absence due to Covid-19, we have been fortunate that we have been able to have a qualified member of staff leading the teaching in all classes. Our aim is to ensure that we remain open throughout what remains of the pandemic and continue to provide a high quality education for your children. This may, on occasion, mean that your child will be taught by a teacher other than their regular one and I know that you will support the school and be understanding of this need, if and when it may occur. In the event of us receiving notice of a positive Covid-19 case, we will notify the parents in the class where the positive case is. You will be aware from the daily news reports that the rate at which the infection is spreading remains high and so for the next few weeks at least we will be restricting the number of parents and carers visiting school. Face masks must be worn at all times whilst in the school building, we will not allow you to enter the school office without one unless you are exempt. I would also ask that you do not send your child into school if they are displaying Covid-19 symptoms. Thank you, as ever, for your co-operation during these unusual times.

This week's recommendation comes from Miss Williamson.


When I was younger my parents would always read me a 'bedtime story'. I loved this and it helped me to settle down for a super night's sleep.
