Dear Parents,

I would like to begin this week's newsletter by thanking you all for the understanding you have shown school regarding the measures we have had to take due to the ongoing effects of Covid-19.

The colours reflect how quickly your child is responding to each question – red (is slower and needs more work), orange, yellow, green (is the quicker response times).




