
# Marsh Hill Newsletter

### <u>Timeline</u>

During the summer holidays, we had our KS2 corridor decorated with a timeline. This has proven very popular with the children and is not only a fabulous piece of artwork but also an informative guide through history. The timeline begins with the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages, and takes us through to the middle Ages. From there we are taken on a journey through the eras of the Tudors and Stuarts; the Georgians and Victorians bringing us up to the Modern Age. The Modern Age segment encapsulates key events, such as World Wars I and World War II, Voting Rights for Women, the founding of the NHS, Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation and Platinum Jubilee, England's 1966 World Cup victory and the 2012 London Olympics and the Moon Landings. We also recognise important and significant 20<sup>th</sup> Century people, such as Martin Luther King, Nelson Mandela, and Birmingham's own Nobel Peace Prize winning Malala Yousafzai and of course, Queen Elizabeth II who is represented through her Coronation in 1953 (having ascended the throne in 1952) and her Platinum Jubilee in 2022.





## Nut Allergy

People who suffer from nut allergies may develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy, it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction; just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

Due to the potential danger that this causes to the children and adults in our school community, we do have to insist that we are a nut free school: we cannot have nuts in school in any form.

So please can we ask that you do not put any nut products in your child/children's lunch boxes or send any nut products into school as treats (for example, on birthdays or school party days).

Examples of foods that children may bring into school that contain nuts include:

- Peanut butter sandwiches
- Chocolate spreads
- Cereal bars
- Some granola bars
- Cakes that contain nuts
- Biscuits / Cookies that contain nuts

This list is not an exhaustive list, so please check the packaging of products closely. I appreciate that this is an additional thing to check, but I also know that you recognise the importance of taking this necessary and potentially life-saving action.
