Cathy writes: As a school we have a strong culture of respecting each other's differences - part of this culture is our focus on outstanding behaviour and the promotion of our Anti-Bullying Strategy. On Thursday this week we participated in the National Anti-bullying Alliance 'Odd Socks Day' - a simple but effective way of acknowledging that we are all different and it is this diversity that makes our community so rich. It is vital that we as a community understand the definition of bullying to support our children with their relationships and social skills.

At Marsh Hill Primary School we promote the National Anti-Bullying Alliance definition: Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.


