Value of the month - Courage

This week I have been asking children across key stage 2 what courage means to them. Here is an example of their responses.

"Courage is when you find something difficult but you do it anyway, even if it might be hard for you. So maybe if you were at a Theme Park and there is a rollercoaster you are afraid to go on, maybe you find the courage to go on the ride." (Year 3)

"Courage is like bravery. Say if you want to go in a swimming pool but you can't swim, you have to have courage to go in the water. That's what I did when my dad encouraged me and now I can swim." (Year 4)

"When you are courageous you might think you can't do something but you keep trying and you don't give up if something gets in the way of what you want to do." (Year 5)

"If you are afraid of something but you know you should do it, a part of you tell you that you can do this. It might be putting your hand up in class or telling your friends 'no' when they are annoying you." (Year 6)

World Book Day


