My very warmest congratulations to the 74 children who achieved 100% attendance for the spring term. It was lovely to see them rewarded for their achievement in a special school assembly yesterday. I would also like to extend a sincere thank you to all the parents and carers of these pupils for ensuring that they get their children to school on time every day.

Regular school attendance is an important part of giving children the best possible start in life. The aim should be to attend 100% of the time. Children who miss school frequently can fall behind with their work and do less well in exams. Research suggests that pupils who attend school regularly could also be at less risk of getting involved in antisocial behaviour or crime. It also makes it easier to build and maintain friendships with their peers. Below is a table showing how children's percentage attendance equates to the amount of school time missed.
