Focus on the Curriculum: History

The History curriculum at Marsh Hill aims to provide children with a coherent understanding of Britain's past and that of the wider world. Our aims are to fulfil the requirements of the National Curriculum for history; providing a broad, balanced and differentiated curriculum; ensuring the progressive development of historical concepts, knowledge and skills; and for the children to develop a love for history. Furthermore, we aim to inspire in pupils a curiosity and fascination about history that will lead to pupils leaving Marsh Hill wanting to know more. Pupils in EYFS work towards being an "Exceptional Explorer" through planned adult led activities and child initiated activities in the continuous provision.

The aims of teaching history in our school are:

- to inspire pupils' curiosity to discover more about the past and to develop an understanding that enables them to enjoy all that history has to offer;
- to enable children to know about significant events in British history and to appreciate how things have changed over time;
- to develop a good sense of chronology;
- to have some knowledge and understanding of historical development in the wider world;
- to help children understand society and their place within it, so that they develop a sense of their own cultural heritage;
- to develop in children the skills of enquiry, investigation, analysis, evaluation, debate, interpretation, problem solving and presentation.

We aim to provide a curriculum that is meaningful and engages our children. To teach history effectively, we look to teach and implement key skills throughout a broad range of topics. We aim to equip children with skills, vital knowledge and deep understanding that they need as they develop their own historical perceptions.

The Importance of Reading

Reading is the secret to introducing knowledge that can help children through difficult choices in life and expand their imaginative skills. The importance of reading for children cannot be underplayed, as it lays the foundation for their mental development and improves their reasoning skills. It also significantly improves their language and vocabulary development. Children who read frequently and who are read to regularly,

improve their reading skills; it is definitely a case of "practice makes perfect". So please ensure that you build in sometime each day to read with your children.
