#### Focus on the Curriculum: Geography

At Marsh Hill Primary School, we aim to deliver a curriculum that is inspiring and ambitious. Our curriculum builds on children's prior knowledge, ensuring that there is a clear progression of skills throughout both key stages. We aim to deliver high-quality lessons in both History and Geography, using a wealth of practical and online resources. The geography curriculum at Marsh Hill enables children to develop knowledge and skills that are transferable to other curriculum areas and which promote their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. Geography is, by nature, an investigative subject, which develops an understanding of concepts, knowledge and skills. Although children need to remember key content that is taught, we want to equip children with the skills they need to be geographers. Our curriculum is designed to ensure that teaching equips pupils with knowledge about diverse places, people, resources and natural and human environments, together with a deep understanding of the earth's key physical and human processes. We make links with our local environment when possible in order to provide context when learning. As pupils progress through the school, they will be exposed to a range of topics that will enable them to develop and extend their geographical skills to the wider world. Geographical knowledge and skills are progressive and are sequenced to provide the framework and approaches that provide explanation of how the earth's features at different scales are shaped, interconnected and change over time. We seek to inspire in children a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people which will remain with them for the rest of their lives, equipping them well for further education and beyond. skills document. Teachers have identified the key knowledge and skills of each half termly topic and theses are mapped across the school, ensuring that knowledge builds progressively and that children develop skills systematically. This progression document ensures the curriculum is covered and the skills/knowledge taught is progressive from year group to year group. Existing knowledge is checked at the beginning of each topic, as part of the KWL strategy (What I know, What I would like to Know and What I have Learned). This ensures that teaching is informed by the children's starting points and encourages our pupils to be reflective learners. At the end of each topic, key knowledge is reviewed by the children and consolidated as necessary. Teachers aim to provide appropriate challenge to all learners, in line with our school's commitment to inclusion.






