Road Safety Week

This week we have been taking part in Road Safety Week. The children have been thinking about what we need to do to make sure our journeys are safe.

The children know that one of the reasons that people get hurt on roads is because cars and other vehicles often travel too fast; and some of them have indicated that they do not always feel safe because of all the traffic around school at the beginning and end of the school day.

The children also discussed how we travel, who we share our roads with and how we can all use roads safely.

They agreed that grown-ups can help us too.

Younger children should always hold hands with a grown-up when walking near roads. They should always sit in a special car seat to protect them when travelling by car.

Children know that when they are riding their bikes, they should do so on a safe path away from traffic and wear a helmet to protect their head if they fall off.

Our older children learnt that we all share a responsibility to use roads safely, and this includes people who walk, scoot and ride, as well as people who drive.

The children have been asked to talk to their parents or carers and remind them to drive at safe speeds, especially around school and in areas where people live, work and play; to never use their phone while driving; and to always wear a seat belt.

We finished Road Safety Week by having a series of workshops in all classes delivered by PCSO Long.

It is the responsibility of parents and carers to monitor their children when collecting from school at the end of the day. Unfortunately, there are the same few children who repeatedly go on the school equipment without permission or supervision. It would greatly help a more peaceful end to the school day if parents and carers would exit the school playground once they have collected their children. I would like to thank the very large majority of parents who do monitor their children and leave the school premises promptly with them at the end of the day.

Children in Need


