PARKING ON PAVEMENTS

Some motorists park fully on the pavement or up against street furniture. This blocks pedestrians and other road-users from getting past. This is a particular concern for emergency vehicles and buses, as well as people with buggies or disabilities. Parking on pavements can also cause damage not only to paving slabs, but underground services. Parking on pavements where there are double yellow lines is also an offence.
