The Domino Hunt was also great fun, where the children had to scour across school to count all the domino dots that were attached to the staff! A massive congratulations to Eva and Shawaiz for counting the correct number, a huge 256! Well done also to our other Competition Winners who explained how Number Day had inspired them:

Alizay (EYFS) not only decorated her own Number Day outfit, but she independently completed all Number Day activities that were set.

Mikail (Y1) came up with a unique job that uses maths - a chef! He thought of this independently and could confidently explain that a chef needs to: have good money skills to see if they can afford new food to cook, count how many items of food he has and measure foods to make cakes e.g. flour and sugar.

Chelsea (Y2) worked really hard and thrived on Number Day. She worked well in a team and could thoroughly explain why vets use maths in their jobs. Chelsea said that "Vets use maths because they need to count the heartbeats of an animal and measure the correct amount of medicine to give to an injured pet."

Esme (Y5) said "It inspired me to become a doctor or a teacher". Esme now has a great appreciation for just how integral maths is to our everyday lives. She had great fun and would even like to replicate 'Number Day' at home with Family.

Number Day was a great success and thoroughly enjoyed by all the children across school. A big thank you to Miss Wright, Ms. Morrison and Mrs Hunt for organising Number Day. And thank you to parents and carers for all for the donations: together we raised £182.40 for the NSPCC.
