World Book Day

This year's theme is 'Reading Your Way!' so what better way to kick start the celebrations than by giving our children the choice on how we choose to celebrate; last week the children voted to come dressed in their pyjamas to mark the occasion.

Throughout the day there were many opportunities to read and be read to including a story read by a different teacher! We have had many discussions around our right to choose what we read and what we enjoy, variety is the spice of life!

We celebrated the much loved stories and illustrations by the famous children's author Anthony Browne, who was voted our author of the month at the end of February. We did this through a range of fun-filled activities such as art, drama, debates, P.E sessions and writing!

All children will have come home with a £1 book token which

they can use to buy one of the listed books or towards the cost of another book of their choice from a book retailer, or why not save it to use at our upcoming book fair during the week beginning 18th March?



To launch Science Day, we started off with a very informative assembly. A Severn Trent representative visited our school to inform us about how water is recycled and the ways in which we use water. Our fantastic volunteers from Year 4 shared how water is recycled at Severn Trent and is then distributed through pipes underground to our houses. We were shown the different items we should bin or flush. Items such as wet wipes, toys, phones and nappies should never be flushed as they block the pipes that carry the sewage. 'Be a binner not a blocker' is our motto!

Year 1

Year 1 have loved Science Day! In the morning, we created a poster showing ways in which water is important. We then discussed how we use water in our everyday lives and completed a few activities on Purple Mash. In the afternoon, Year 1 completed a science lesson of our current topic 'Animals including Humans.' We learnt about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores, and sorted animals into these three groups. Year 1 have learnt so much about water on Science Day, and will definitely remember how to not block a toilet!



Year 2

After our assembly, we started the day by learning the Water Song from Severn Trent. We also talked about, and watched, a short clip on plastics in the seas, rivers and oceans and talked about what could happen.

We were lucky to be able to use the VR headsets to look at pictures from under the sea and paper and bottle recycling.



Throughout the day we created posters, read a newspaper report about wet wipes blocking sewers, wrote letters explaining about plastics in the environment and learnt what can and can't be recycled.





What have we learnt on Science Day? What do we know now that we didn't know this morning? I learnt that I need to recycle not throw things in the toilet - Aliza I learnt that plastic is harmful to fish - Chloe. I learnt that animals can die because of plastic, they might it, they might get it stuck on their head. - Rayan We only put three things in the toilet; toilet paper, pee and poo - Selena We learnt that things can block sewage pipes and cause a flood in someone elses house - Cayci That sometimes the plastic that the fish can get into our tummies when we eat fish fingers - Lilah. We saw the ocean, the animals and a recycling centre on the VR headsets. - Aairah Plastic can remain whole for 500 years - Amelja. Dont throw plastic bags in the ocean because it makes animals stuck -Mehar. I didnt know how plastic bottles were recycled - Jaxon. We could use metal and smooth wood to make toys - Anderson.

Year 3

Year 3 have had an amazing time today! We have learned about the importance of hydration. Did you know children should drink 6-8 glasses of water a day? It improves concentration and keeps you healthy. In the afternoon, we learned about how shadows and reflections are created. We were able to explore different images to notice and observe shadows and reflections using VR headsets. We also explored ways to save water. We were able to create some fantastic posters to show this.





Year 4

Year 4 took part in a workshop provided by Severn Trent water. The focus was saving water. We worked in teams and were given a fictional family. We measured out the water that each family used and decided who were water wasters or water savers.



Tilly - The workshop was so much fun, I liked being able to work as part of a team and getting to measure the water.

Abdurrahman - It was really informative and it linked to measuring maths.

Skylear - It was interesting deciding who was a water waster and water saver.
